WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

Cf. Is 48: 20

Jesus tells us "This I command you: love one another." Saint John repeats this teaching with the exhortation that we love one another, going so far as to insist that whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.

How hard it can be to love others. The cost often seems unbearable - how can I give and give of myself, even to those I *want* to love, to say nothing of those with whom I struggle?



Nemo dat quod non habit - 'you can't give what you don't have' - is an old Roman legal maxim that applies here as well. If we don't feel loved, if we haven't received and experienced love, we will find ourselves unable to love others. Lost in our own woundedness, we may even find ourselves repeating the kinds of words and actions that so deeply hurt us in the past.

We all need to approach the Lord for healing and compassion - especially in the sacraments. Sometimes we must first give ourselves permission to receive what He offers. It starts with a simply invitation: "In the name of Jesus, I give myself permission to receive God's love. In the name of Jesus, I give God permission to love me in the ways I need most."

after the ascension of Christ and chosen by the Holy Spirit to replace Judas, little more is known about Matthias save that he was present throughout Jesus ministry.

The reliquary of Saint Matthias is in Padua (pictured above). May we call on him to intercede for us, that we may likewise be faithful to Christ and serve Him faithfully as His disciples.

Motherhood takes many shape in the care of one's own children (living & deceased), offering of motherly care to those nearby, in maternal love yet waiting for the opportunity to be be expressed. We are blessed to by all those who seek to be 'mom' to us.





Unconditional Acceptance



ven through Joseph's fears, God's will, his history and his plan were at work. Joseph, then, teaches us that faith in God includes believing that he can work even through our fears, our frailties and our weaknesses. He also teaches us that amid the tempests of life, we must never be afraid to let the Lord steer our course. At times, we want to be in complete control, yet God always sees the bigger picture....


Joseph accepted Mary unconditionally. He trusted in the angel's words.... Often in life, things happen whose meaning we do not understand. Our first reaction is frequently one of disappointment and rebellion. Joseph set aside his own ideas in order to accept the course of events and, mysterious as they seemed, to embrace them, take responsibility for them and make them part of his own history. Unless we are reconciled with our own history, we will be unable to take a single step forward, for we will always remain hostage to our expectations and the disappointments that follow.

The spiritual path that Joseph traces for us is not one that *explains*, but *accepts*. Only as a result of this acceptance, this reconciliation, can we begin to glimpse a broader history, a deeper meaning.... Joseph is certainly not passively resigned, but courageously and firmly proactive. In our own lives, acceptance and welcome can be an expression of the Holy Spirit's gift of fortitude. Only the Lord can give us the strength needed to accept life as it is, with all its contradictions, frustrations and disappointments.

FOR REFLECTION:

- Put yourself in Joseph's shoes. What were his expectations for his life and his future? Do you think it was difficult for him to let go of those ideas? What gave him the strength to do so?
- Are there times in my life where I have had to let go and trust God unconditionally, as Joseph did? What happened when I did?
- Am I held "hostage" by expectations about what my life should be, or should have been? Have the disappointments in my life embittered me, or am I able to "accept life as it is"?
