₩JMJ¥ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord,for I cry to you all the day long.Cf. Ps 86 (85): 1-3

"Does this shock you? Do you also want to leave?" After spending weeks on the Bread of Life discourse of Jesus in the Gospel of John, we come to a crucial moment: the decision of whether or not to follow Him. In only slightly varying ways, Jesus repeats at least six times one of the most challenging teachings: "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Who wouldn't be shocked!?!



Would any of us eat the flesh or drink the blood of another? Yet Jesus is offering us His own Body and Blood as food. Moreover, He teaches that if we refuse, *we can not go to heaven* - we will not have eternal life without having eaten His flesh and having drank His blood.

Do we believe that what we receive is truly Jesus? How does our approach to communion reflect the greatness of the gift He offers us? August 22, 2021 It's actually pretty rare for a person to ask **"what should I wear to Mass?"** We know that going to Church is distinct from more casual affairs. Yet every Catholic is tempted



at some point - especially in the hotter seasons - toward excuses from dressing accordingly.

Before leaving home, consider this: if Jesus returned in glory at this Sunday's Mass, how would our choice of clothing reflect our reverence, affection, and love for Him?

August 24 is the feast of the Apostle Saint Bartholomew. Though little is known of him, save his being named in the Gospels (in the Gospel of John he is referred to as Nathaniel) and the Acts of the Apostles, tradition holds that he preached in India and Greater

Armenia before being martyred by King Astyages.

Because of the nature of his death (being flayed alive), Saint Bartholomew is among other things - the patron saint of tanners, leatherworks, and butchers.

We should care for the earth, use our money wisely and get to know our neighbors and their needs. We must advocate for social policies that respect human

dignity and human freedom.

It does not matter our position or stage in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!




