Cf. Daniel 3:42

... But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.

Today in both the Old Testament and New, we hear of the generosity of the Lord in bestowing His gifts. At the request of Moses for assistance, the God's spirit is bestowed on the seventy elders. Jesus goes a step further in empowering those who follow Him to perform mighty deeds in His name.

In each account, there is a temptation that arises: a spirit of envy against others who have received the same gift. Envy, recall, is distinct from jealousy inasmuch as jealousy generally wants simply to possess while envy desires to destroy the good things another has. Envy is



one of the deadly sins because it tears down not only the gift, but also a person who has it.

The psalm today has the antidote: taking joy in the laws and decrees of the Lord. And what is that law? Not simply lists of rules and mandates (though He has given us those too!), but above all a law of love: love the Lord your God with your whole heart and love your neighbor as yourself.

Jesus spends His whole life, from His conception to His offering on the cross, to demonstrate the alternative to envy. May we also embrace joy in the Lord and each other. September 26, 2021 Wednesday, September 29 is the feast of the Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael archangels all three.



Did you know that each archangel has their own prayer? The most commonly known prayer is to Saint Michael, but Gabriel and Raphael have their own - each tied to their special role in salvation history.

During this jubilee year of Saint Joseph, we have been praying a prayer to him after Mass, but there's always time to ask the archangels for their intercession on our behalf.

As you may have heard on Wednesday, I came to the difficult decision of eliminating the position of Pastoral Assistant for Liturgy and Parish Life. As a result, this week was Veronica Olson's last in ministry at Saint Mark parish. Veronica has served for many years in our community, both in sharing the blessing of her talent & skill in music as well as in organizing and managing many liturgical & parish ministries. 

The composition of mosaic tiles allows the entire picture to change with the light, affording the viewer an ongoing change during their meditation, prayer or viewing time.


