Cf. Ps 130 (129): 3-4

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

"As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, 'Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" How earnest, how eager is this man: he **runs** to Jesus. Not only that, despite his careful attention to the law of God - and his efforts are great! - he recognizes that something is lacking. So he seeks out the Lord for direction.



Of this man's story, what is most relatable is the conclusion: when Jesus challenges him to give what he has to the

poor, he finds that he can't part with his many possessions - and he goes away sad.

Possessions are not the sole nor the biggest stumbling block for most of us. We **absolutely** can and should be giving to the poor. Most of us give far too little and we will face judgment for our miserly-ness. Yet there are many elements of our lives that bind us - always tied to desires: physical appetites (overeating, sexual sin), authority & respect (gossip, uncharitable conversations), and security (hoarding money & possessions), to name a few!

This is the good news of Christ: with God it is possible to be free to enjoy - in moderation! the goods entrusted to us **and** to follow Him. It starts with a willingness to give all to Jesus. October 10, 2021 October 15 is the memorial of **Saint Teresa of Jesus**. Saint Teresa was a Carmelite nun and mystic who helped reform the Carmelite Order. Later joined by



Saint John of the Cross, they helped establish the Discalced Carmelites.

Saint Teresa was canonized some forty years after her death and became one of the few saints declared a Doctor of the Church just fifty years ago. Let us ask her intercession on our behalf and that of the whole Church!

Archbishop Etienne has recently started the archdiocesan pastoral plan. In his video online, he explains that "it's to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ". This multi-year plan is not a top-down initiative nor a one-sizefits-all program. Rather, it is a broad effort to join together in discerning God's will for the work of our archdiocese as a whole and each of our individual parishes. In the coming months, we will be doing our part to join in

that discernment.

Multi-Faith Dialogue for a More Humane Justice System

Learn about TEACH (Taking Education and Creating History), a remarkably innovative prisoner education program founded by Kimonti Carter who joined a gang at the age of 11 and at 18 was sentenced to 700 years in prison for his role in a drive-by shooting in 1997. Against all odds, he became an inspirational role model within the prison system. As a youth he was part of a community profoundly impacted by a city's disinvestment in housing, education and employment and the governmental policy shifts of the 1990's.

A Film, a Conversation and a Call to Action

The film, **Since I Been Down**, is told by the people who have lived these conditions and it unravels why children commit violent crime and how these children-now adultsare breaking free from their fate by creating a model of justice that is transforming their lives, our humanity and the quality of life for all children.

Once registered for this event a link will be sent to view the film at our convenience between October 16 and 19. Then, meet on Zoom on October 24 for a conversation with multi-faith leaders to discuss the film and identify ways to take action to transform our justice system. After the conversation participants will leave with a better understanding of the criminal justice laws in Washington state and concrete ways we to take action towards a system of transformative justice.

Featured panelists come from the producers of the film, The Freedom Project, the Kavana Cooperative, Plymouth Church, Seattle and more.

Event partners include St. Joseph Catholic Church, the American Civil Liberties Union, the Anti-Defamation League, the Center for Children & Youth Justice, the Church Council of Greater Seattle, the Episcopal Diocese of Olympia, the Holocaust Center for Humanity & more. World Mission Sunday

World Mission Sunday, organized by the Propagation of the Faith, is a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and sacrifice.


Annually, World Mission Sunday is celebrated on the next-to-the last Sunday in October, this year October 24. As described by Pope John Paul II, World Mission Sunday is "an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration and for all the missions of the world" (Redemptoris Missio 8:1).

Pope John Paul II also spoke of the Propagation of the Faith's General Fund of support, calling this a "central fund of solidarity."

In a message delivered on a recent World Mission Sunday, the Pope said, "The offerings that will be collected are destined for a common fund of solidarity distributed, in the Pope's name, by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith among the missions and missionaries of the entire world."

These donations assist the Pope in the evangelization efforts of particular Churches, in the formation of local clergy, in raising missionary awareness in children and in encouraging the missionary dimension of Christan faith. Pope Francis in his message for 2020 stated that "in this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah, "Here am I, send me" (6:8)."
