WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

- Father Jacob Maurer

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

Cf. Ps 66 (65): 1-2

Today we hear the account of the restoration of Peter. As opposed to his three-fold denial of Jesus, Peter receives a three-fold charge. Three times Jesus asks Peter if he loves Him, responding each time with a renewal of the commission that Peter received at the Last Supper: 'feed my lambs', 'tend my sheep', and 'feed my sheep'.

Where Peter had renounced Jesus thrice, Jesus now elicits a three-fold proclamation of love - and affirms Peter as himself loved and trusted.




Perhaps it is no surprise that Peter's love is not yet perfected. The man who denied the Lord on the eve of His Passion can't bring himself to match the level of love that Christ asks of

him. The Greek of Christ's 'love' is *agape* - the highest form of love - while Peter responds with *phileo* - brotherly love. But Jesus knows that this is what Peter is capable of offering at this time. Rather than scolding or scorning what Peter gives Him, He accepts it and exhorts Peter to prepare for the path ahead.

Though we often find ourselves unable to match the perfect commitment of Christ, let us never be afraid to offer imperfect gifts! Jesus will bless them and, as He did for Peter, build us up towards perfect apostleship. May crowning is a traditional Catholic devotion that honors Mary in her role as mother of Jesus. Spanning across both the East and the West, this practice began around the time of the Council of Ephesus (AD 431) and became widespread around the end of the 16th century.

Though it can be celebrated at any time, it is most commonly celebrated in May, as this month is dedicated to both Mary and mothers.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!

Mental Health Awareness Month




St. Mark Catholic Classical School Registration is Open for Fall 2022

"Affirmation of Life" Memorial Holy Family Meditation Garden

This unique and beautiful mosaic was sponsored, built and is maintained by Council 11217. The idea for a memorial started over 15 years ago. The final project cost over \$100,000 and is truly a sight to behold as a testimonial to the support of life by Knights of Columbus and our many supporters.

The composition of mosaic tiles allows the entire picture to change with the light, affording the viewer an ongoing change during their meditation, prayer or viewing time.

Many of our supporters, parishioners, friends and family members have purchased memorial pavers in this tranquil garden to support the Knights' Pro- Life activities. 
