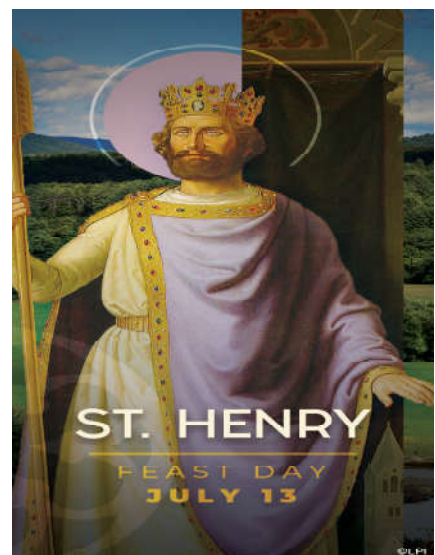

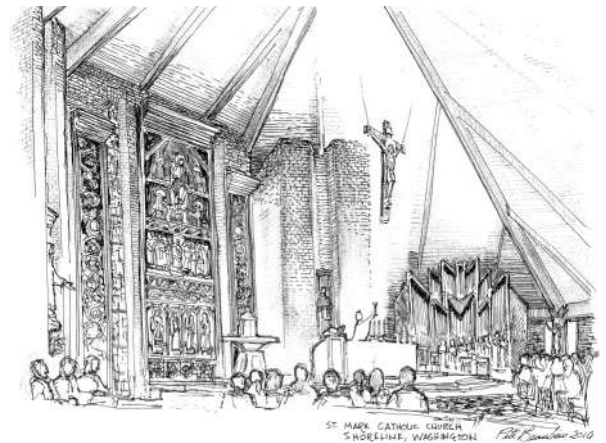

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

As for me, in justice I shall behold your face;
I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

The story of the Good Samaritan is immediately familiar to Christians. Even the title calls to mind the exhortation of the Lord to care for the needy in our midst - especially those who might otherwise be off-putting, repulsive, or even our enemies. The selflessness of the Samaritan - rather than the selfishness of the priest and Levite - is our model.

But I would like to focus on the victim - because he too is a model for us. Neither hero nor villain, he is an entirely passive character in this story. He is treated and bandaged, lifted up and conveyed to shelter, his care paid and provided for by a stranger he could never repay.



We might naturally desire to be the hero of someone else's story - to be a good Samaritan who comes upon another in need, rises to the occasion, and provides for their needs.

Being the victim, accepting care we can never repay, assuming a role where we receive without giving anything in return - this is a level of humble vulnerability that makes many, maybe most, of us quite uncomfortable.

But it is here that we find ourselves living the Gospel: that it is *Jesus* who is the Good Samaritan and we who are the ones in need of care. How might we better 'go and do likewise' if first we allow the Lord to minister to us?

July 11 is the **memorial of Saint Benedict**, abbot and founder of the Order of Saint Benedict. Originally a hermit, nearby monks asked him to lead them.



He warned them that he would be too strict for them - this proved so true that they later attempted to poison him! He eventually founded his own monastery in Monte Cassino, which became the model of the Church's monastic system. His *Rule of Saint Benedict* still guides communities throughout the world - including our own archdiocese at Saint Martin Abbey in Lacey!

In 2006, Jake Finkbonner - a young boy and parishioner at Saint Joseph in Ferndale, Washington - cut his lip while playing basketball. Two days later he was airlifted to Seattle Children's Hospital in a desperate attempt to treat the necrotizing fasciitis that was spreading through his body. Meanwhile, the Lummi community began praying to Kateri to intercede on his behalf. The day after a relic of Kateri was touched to Jake's leg, the doctors called to share the news that the infection had completely left him. This second miracle of Kateri ultimately paved the way for her canonization in 2012.

Synod Synthesis for the Archdiocese

In 2020 the Archbishop initiated a pastoral planning process in the Archdiocese of Seattle beginning with 90 listening sessions. From these sessions emerged three pastoral priorities for the local Church: to encounter Jesus Christ and one another; to accompany each other as one human family on a journey of discipleship; and to live the unconditional love and joy of the Gospel. These efforts to engage the faithful in dialogue provided timely preparation for the diocesan phase of Pope Francis' global Synod on Synodality.

Synodal listening is mutual collaborative listening, guided by the Holy Spirit in which all of the faithful have something to learn from each other, in order to know what God is saying to the Church (catholicapostolatecenter.org).

A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together" in company with the Holy Spirit. This past winter, 174 churches and missions throughout the Archdiocese of Seattle, including St. Mark, invited parishioners to participate in listening sessions designed to hear the concerns, fears and dreams of communities. Also invited to participate were grade schools, high schools, universities, prison ministers, Catholic Community Services, priests, deacons and women religious.

This process has helped bring to the surface many hopes and dreams for the future: to not leave anyone behind, to speak to people in the realities of their lives, for people to become more involved beyond just coming to Mass, for a Church that values all its members and seeks the active involvement of all in ministries, to attempt to find bridges that unite diverse groups, to name just a few thoughts brought forward.

Sacred Heart Radio

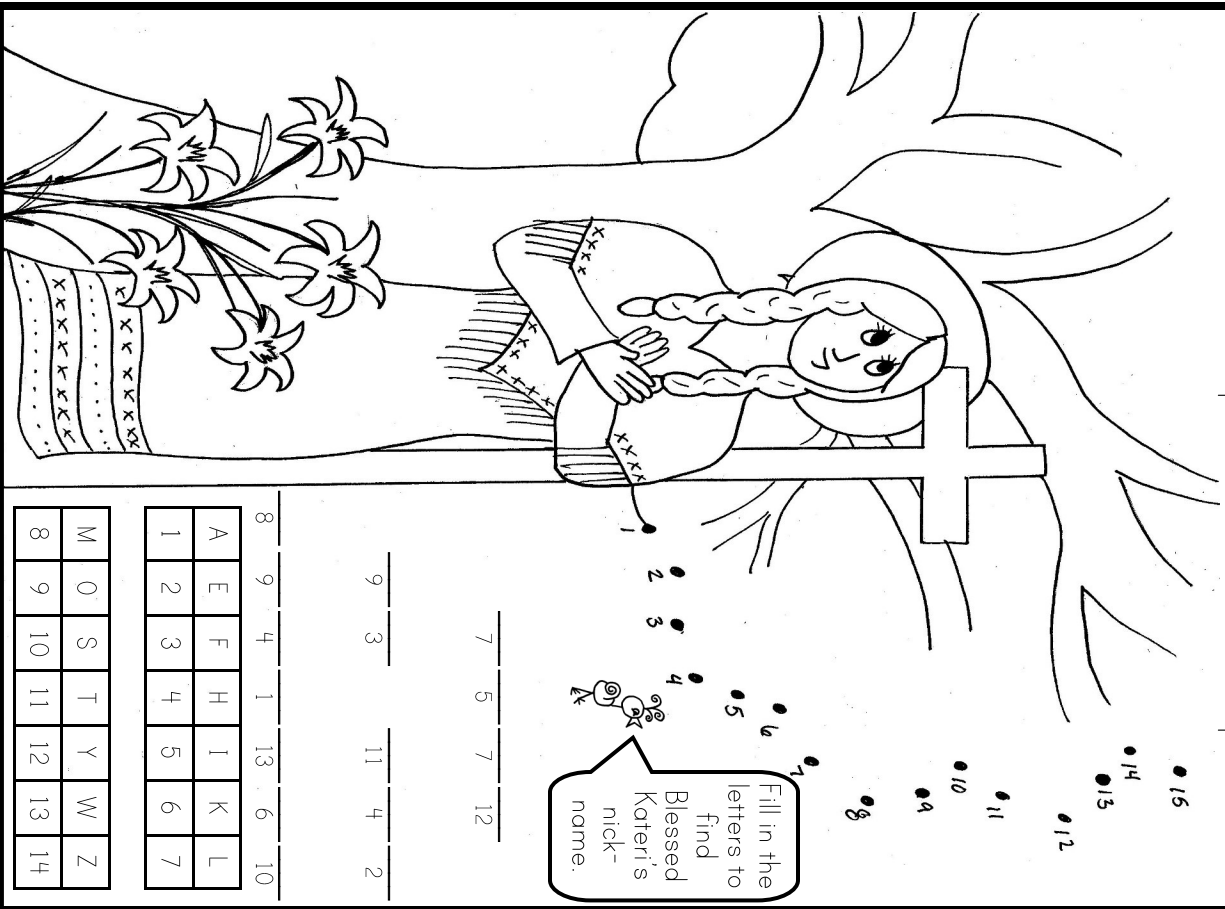

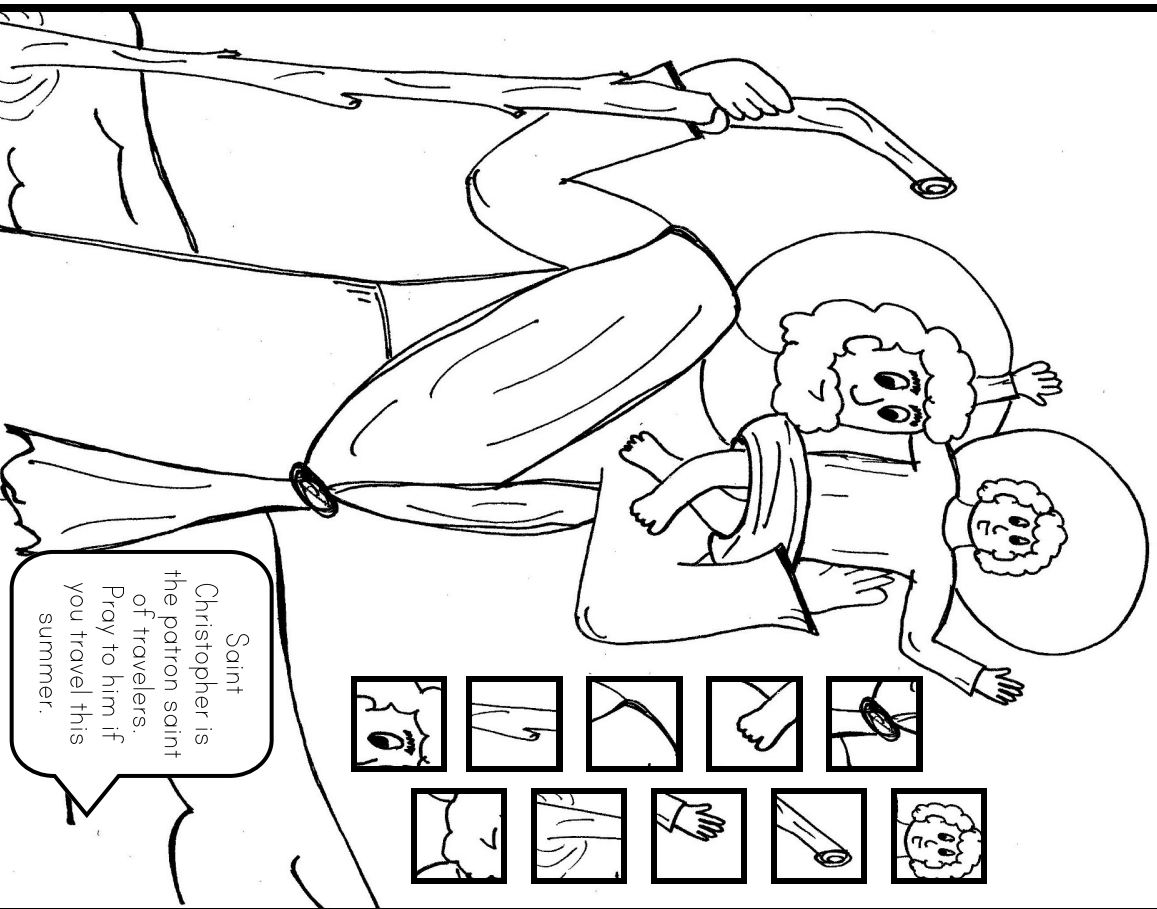

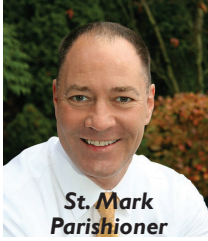
