# ₩ımı¥ WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT?

God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people.

The account of Abraham's boldness in interceding for Sodom is striking. Not once or twice, but six times he appeals to the mercy of the Lord. Each time he asks God to offer lenience for the sake of the few, finally stopping at a threshold of ten good people. One might wonder if Abraham was afraid to push his luck by dropping the number further.

And yet, it is probable that the Lord was trying to encourage Abraham to do just that!



Though Abraham approaches timidly, speaking fearfully, the Lord never once rebukes Abraham's appeals. He responds in the affirmative,

easily offering greater and greater mercy.

There is a lesson here about how Sodom was so completely corrupted (not even ten good people lived there!), but a more powerful lesson about God's goodness and His desire for us to fearless ask Him for gifts.

How often are we reluctant to even approach God, much less press upon Him for the mercies that we so desperately need and the good things we so deeply desire!

What would change in our relationship with God if we saw Him not as a reluctant quartermaster but as a joyful giver, as delighted to show us His goodness?

July 24, 2022

July 25 is the feast of Saint James the Greater. 'The Greater' was to distinguish him from the other James among the Apostles and refers to his age or height (not necessarily importance!).



In addition to being an important figure in the life of the Church, Saint James the Greater is the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Seattle, with both the proto-cathedral in Vancouver and the cathedral in Seattle named after him.

In the liturgical practice of the Church, **Masses may be offered for particular intentions**. By Church law, every pastor is required to offer a Sunday Mass for the intention of the people of the parish or *pro populo* (this is always our 8:30 am Sunday Mass). At Saint Mark parish, we dedicate one Mass for the intention of parish & school faculty & staff (the Saturday vigil Mass) and

one Mass for Archbishop Etienne and the clergy of the archdiocese (the 10:30 am Sunday Mass).



## Learning Intercessory Prayer

~By Deacon Richard Labrecque Prayer is dialogue, a true communion with the God who is our benefactor and lover. One important aspect of prayer is intercessory prayer - asking not for what we want or need but joining in fellowship with the needs of others.

Intercessory prayer is one task that God has placed on my heart. It is a charism that I did not ask for, but something deep inside told me this is what I personally am called to participate in. How id it begin? I don't remember exactly.

Maybe someone asked for my prayer and because it was instilled within me through my upbringing to fulfill a promise, I knew that if I committed to pray for them, I needed to fulfill that as an obligation not to be neglected. But once this process got really going, the generation of interior satisfaction added to a sense of mere "obligation," and I found intercessory prayer one of my better gifts. Isn't it amazing how we are guided by the Holy Spirit, even when we are least aware of his leading, how he is connecting the dots?

Over the years my technique has evolved and expanded. It had to, because, as one can easily imagine, these "obligations" tend to grow and expand over many years of intercessory prayer. In some cases the intentions are held for only a short period of time. The Spirit will let you know when it is OK to let them slide away. But if you are listening and faithful to the Spirit, this letting go does not happen unless he gives you permission - something you just feel inside. His discipline alone is also part of your training, your perfection.

Here is an example of how the Holy Spirit teaches me to pray. In praying for the situation in Ukraine - my first inclination was to invoke St. Michael in warrior fashion and think of the many ways the aggressor could be defeated - I spent too many nights and days dreaming about this. Then I got the message/correction that this is now how I was to pray. The physical battle is God's, not mine. My duty was to pray for the situation and be in solidarity with God's plans. When I began to pray this way, then my peace returned, and my prayers were for God's activity, not mine or the armies engaged.

#### Learning Intercessory Prayer, Continued

Remember Christ's words that we pray daily - "Thy will be done" - be in solidarity with God, not our ways or our plans. It's a hard lesson, but there is where truth lies.

So, I don't try to provide God my plans, I simply lift these folks or situations up to God in worship and say in my spirit, "your will be done!" My offering to God is to be engaged in this prayer - "my will" is the offering - the result is God's, and in that there is peace.


