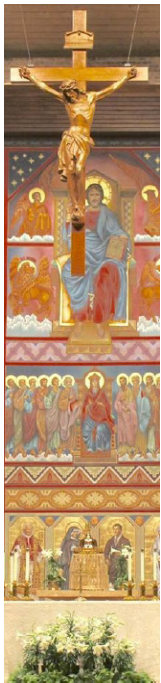
The Bible and the Virgin Mary - Part I

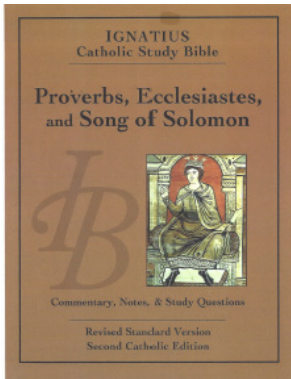

What does it mean to be pro-life?

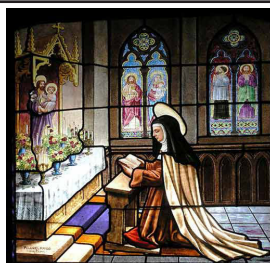
During October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) has [a webpage with resources for individuals & groups](#) - I encourage you to visit it for more information.

Though respect for life starts with the conviction that every human being is to be cherished from conception to natural death, our conviction must be matched by actions.



Do you notice a theme in the first reading and Gospel today? The Lord attends to the material needs of the people first. Moreover, He attends to the needs *that they present to Him*....needs that, quite frankly, are not as important as their eternal salvation!

Yet these things that are what occupy their minds and hearts. Though true, to say ‘that’s not what’s *really* important’ would have conveyed a deeper message: ‘your worries don’t matter to God....or me’. Instead, the Lord takes the time to heal Naaman and the ten lepers - even knowing that some would take their newfound health and receive nothing more. We are called to do likewise - addressing first the needs of others so that they might hear the Gospel we proclaim in our words and actions.



This Saturday, October 15, is the memorial of **Saint Teresa of Ávila** - also called Saint Teresa of Jesus.

Though she desired a greater relationship with the Lord, the laxity of her community caused great difficulty in pursuing her desire for Him. Later in life she received a mystical experience of union with God that shaped the remainder of her life.

That intimacy with the Lord spurred her to write works still treasured today, help reform the Carmelites, and is why she was eventually named a Doctor of the Church. [Read more about her online at the Teresian Sisters’ site.](#)
