

This June, the priests continued their parish family consultation process at Priest Days. They reviewed the new maps and potential parish families based on the feedback they provided at the May 3 gathering. Together they prayed and discussed:

- the overall process
- additional changes for the potential parish family configurations
- the importance of lay leaders and staff
- how to remain centered on mission throughout this process

November – Oversight and Presbyteral Council will review all feedback and provide their recommendations to Archbishop Etienne for his discernment.

Early 2024 – Final parish family plan will be released.

July 2024 – Parish families, under the leadership of one pastor, will begin.

Cf. Ps 68 (67): 6-7, 36

God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people.

Did you notice a common thread in today's readings? Despite being four different genres of writing - story, psalm, letter, and parable each rests on a simple foundation: that there is a clear difference between good and evil, and that we are responsible for both knowing & living in accordance with what is good.

Solomon prays for wisdom to judge between right & wrong, we proclaimed (in the psalms) the goodness of God's commands, Saint Paul



exhorts us to live as the chosen ones of God that we are, and Jesus speaks of the final judgment of the wicked and the righteous.

Even in ancient times, subjective truth - defining truth by what

an individual wants - has always been a temptation. Pontius Pilate famously asked our Lord 'what is truth?', trying to absolve himself for condemning Christ to death on the cross.

As Christians, we know that Truth is objective, rooted in God, the source of all that is good, true, and beautiful. Like Solomon, may we pray for the wisdom and will to always choose what is good, proclaim what is true, and so live as brothers & sisters of Jesus Christ!

August 4 is the memorial of Saint John Vianney, patron saint of parish priests. Despite being poorly educated, Saint John Vianney had a zeal for winning souls to Christ, especially in the celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation - often



spending hours in the confessional.

In a time when there is a grave need for parish priests, we would do well to ask his intercession that many young men - from our own families! - would hear, receive, and answer the call to serve God & His people as priests. Saint John Vianney, pray for us!

The Young Adult group's summer board game nights are ongoing! Every Saturday evening, after the vigil Mass, adults of any age are invited to join in playing board games, good company, and snacks.
